Some of the programs designed to help PSD students prepare for college are listed below. Several programs have opportunities for earning college credits along the way at no cost to students or their families.



Accelerating Students through Concurrent Enrollment (ASCENT): Defer your diploma for an extra year and spend your fifth year of high school taking college courses at no cost to you.



Advanced Placement (AP): Take one or more of the many college-level AP courses offered in PSD. Earning a good score on an AP exam can earn you college credit or allow you to skip certain courses in college.



Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID): This program helps raise the achievement and chances of college success for underrepresented students through increased support and rigorous expectations.



Associate Degree Pathway: Earn an associate degree while still in high school without having to pay tuition.



Concurrent Enrollment: Earn college credits by taking college courses on a college campus or taking college courses by specially trained teachers at your high school.



International Baccalaureate (IB): The IB Diploma is a rigorous, globally recognized degree that prepares students for college - students graduate with 24 credits already earned toward their future college degree.



Pathways in Technology Early College High Schools (PTECH): Poudre High is one of an exclusive number of high schools in Colorado offering PTECH. Students earn an associate's in manufacturing and industry experience while in high school.



Teacher Recruitment Education & Preparation (TREP): Use a fifth and sixth year of high school to take college courses for future educators.

Participate in career tours, internships, job shadowing, resume building, capstone projects, and more to gain credits and on-the-job experience, network with potential employers, and learn what it's really like to work in different industries before committing to a college major or job pathway. **Work-based learning opportunities also include:**

Apprenticeships – Spend part of the week working in an apprenticeship position through CareerWise, Columbine Health, or Neuworks Plumbing to earn credit, pay, and real-world experience.

Capstone Project – Complete a project based on what you've learned in class with the aid of a local mentor.

Credit-for-work – Earn high school credit for working a part-time job.

Integrated Services:



Alternative Cooperative Education (ACE) -

Students, including students identified as special populations, experience developmentally appropriate career programming.

School to Work Alliance Program (SWAP) – Young people ages 15-24 with mild to moderate employment barriers work to become job ready through work-based learning, career exploration, learning how to write resumes, and more.

Collaboration Among Many Promotes Universal Success (CAMPUS) – Students 18-21 receiving Integrated Services support travel to Colorado State University twice a week to build independent living skills and explore opportunities in the community.

Community Connections – SStudents 18-21 with significant learning needs work on foundational skills to help them transition from high school to adult living.

Cooper Home – Students ages 18-21 receiving Integrated Services support learn work-related skills, prepare for independent living, learn to navigate agency services, and build daily living and social skills.

Project Search – Students in their final year of receiving Integrated Services support from PSD embark on a yearlong internship with the goal of securing a paid, permanent job.
