SUMMARY: Responsible for providing high quality after school and summer extended learning opportunities to the students of Poudre School District. These opportunities include such programs as Camp SOL and PSD After 3 (Club Tres) and others across the district. Duties include recruiting, monitoring, and managing student enrollment, attendance, safety, discipline, and staff-to-child ratio; recruiting, hiring and supervising staff members and volunteers; managing funding sources including large grants such as Title I and 21st Century, budget management and resource allocation; collaborating with community partners and donors; completing required reports and forms; promoting programs to parents, staff and community.
