<u>SUMMARY</u>: Responsible for analyzing, troubleshooting, repairing, and maintaining a large variety of commercial plumbing systems. Maintain domestic hot water and heat circulating pumps, identify drain issues, clear clogged pipes, and install plumbing fixtures. Other duties assigned as knowledge and experience increases.
