1. Art Around the World

WEEK 1 or 2

Looking to take a trip? Take a journey around the world, exploring art at every stop along the way. We'll find inspiration in Africa, China, Japan, Mexico, and more! Come join us for a week of artistic adventure! Paint, sculpt and color your way around the world!

2. Blooming Girls

This is a program that provides a safe and inspiring environment for girls. Girls will develop the life skills needed to reach their highest potential. Week 2

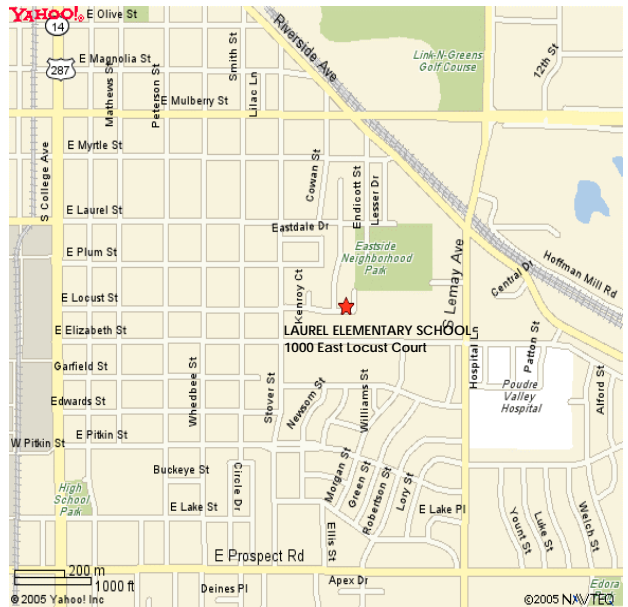
Teacher: Ken Arledge
