

The Poudre School District Board of Education met for its work session on January 27, 2026 at the Johannsen Support Services Center. The agenda for this meeting included:

### **Superintendent report**

Superintendent Brian Kingsley, [during his report](#), recognized January as Board of Education Appreciation Month. He offered thanks and congratulations to the members of the PSD Board for their dedication to the school district community.

He also shared a short video highlighting academic monitoring by educators in PSD schools, and he shared thoughts about the planned discussions on the agenda.

### **Action items and Consent Agenda**

The Board unanimously approved two resolutions, one [supporting the recognition of February as Career and Technical Education Month](#) and the other supporting the [recognition of February 2-6, 2026 as National School Counseling Week](#).

It was also unanimously agreed to approve the Executive Limitation 2.0 for the 2025-2026 monitoring period.

The Board passed its consent agenda unanimously but pulled one item — a lease agreement with the Wellington Food Pantry — to action items; this item was also passed unanimously.

### **Informal Reports / Discussion items**

The first report given during the meeting reviewed the proposed adoption of curriculum materials for K-5 mathematics, English language development, Spanish 1, and German 1. Assistant Superintendent Insoon Olson and Director of Curriculum and Instruction Amanda Kreiger provided a breakdown on the program finalists, implementation process, and costs. The contracts for the curriculum materials will come back before the Board for approval in February

The Board spent a majority of the meeting discussing a report from the [Comprehensive Planning Committee regarding enrollment trends](#) and potential next steps. The committee unanimously agrees that PSD currently has more school buildings than projected student enrollment can support and will now, with the Board's support, shift focus to developing clear, objective criteria that may guide future conversations about consolidation or other facilities-related actions, should the board decide to pursue them.

Brett Hansen, co-chair of the committee, said the group will switch to monthly meetings and will work with the community to develop this criteria, which is anticipated to be presented to the board in May.
