Superintendent report

During his [superintendent report](#), Brian Kingsley began by congratulating all those honored during the PSD Celebrates event held at the Lincoln Center on May 4. He also noted that graduation is quickly coming up, with ceremonies scheduled all throughout May 18-23, and played a newly created video for teacher appreciation week.

Action Items

The board discussed two action items during the May 12 meeting, beginning with Concurrent Enrollment and Dual Enrollment Program expenditures. The [presentation](#) included that 42% of students earned 12 hours of college credit or more with approximately \$20 million of savings for families with that college credit earned; this item passed unanimously.

The second action item handled the [roof abatement for Shepardson Elementary School](#) which passed unanimously.

The board also passed its consent agenda unanimously.

Informal Reports / Discussion items

The primary discussion of the informal reports during the May 12 meeting was [an update on the CPC's work for potential consolidation criteria](#) as well as a first reading of that criteria for a potential further process.

These policies ([FCB](#) and [FCB-R](#)) will come back for a second reading and vote during the May 26 meeting. A [public dashboard](#) has also been posted that provides school-level data on enrollment, building capacity, utilization, facility condition, and other factors the committee is using in its work.
