Superintendent report

During his [superintendent report](#), Brian Kingsley began by congratulating all the graduating seniors as well as the staff and support teams that helped support graduations. He also shared the recently released Grads at a Glance video, which highlighted the seniors class and their experience in high school.

Superintendent Kingsley finished his report by briefly previewing topics on the meeting's agenda, including an update from the Comprehensive Planning Committee and Student Code of Conduct policies.

Action Items

The board's primary discussion during action items focused on the [second reading and vote for proposed policies \(FCB and FCB-R\)](#) presented by the Comprehensive Planning Committee in its continued work in identifying criteria for potential school closure and consolidation decisions.

Lead Assistant Superintendent Dr. Traci Gile and committee co-chair Dr. Brett Hansen reviewed edits to the proposed policies made in response to feedback from board members collected at the May 12 board meeting. Dr. Gile also discussed plans for future action teams that would be part of the process.

The proposed policies were passed with the majority approval of the board. The majority board also voted for the Comprehensive Planning Committee to continue its work to create a recommendation for possible future school closure and consolidation, to be presented to the board in Fall 2026.

The board also passed two other action items during the meeting, one to approve a purchase related to the district's network access control system and the other for a Head Start and Early Head Start continual grant.

Informal Reports / Discussion items

The board also heard a first reading of revisions to twenty student policies included in the Student Code of Conduct, which range from compulsory attendance to student discipline and more. These policies will come back to the June 9 meeting for a second reading and, if approved, will become effective July 1.

Board members also [received a presentation](#) on the [proposed budget for FY2026-27](#). The final budget for the 2026-27 school year will be submitted for adoption on the June 9, 2026 meeting. Members concluded the night by reviewing the Board's budget as well.
