Director Donovan moved that the Board determine that the Superintendent has reasonably interpreted Board of Education Policy EL 2.2 in his Internal Monitoring Report dated June 22, 2023, and that the evidence presented supports the Superintendent's conclusions stated in the Internal Monitoring Report.

Board discussion included:

- Director Anderson shared appreciation for the job the Superintendent has done but said he could not support a \$29,000 raise.
- Gratitude was expressed for the hard work performed by the Superintendent, for moving the district in a positive direction, for excellent communication skills, and for strong interaction with staff and community and students.
- Board of Education seriously considers the finances of the district and believes the pay increase is reasonable.
- Proposed raise parallels the average staff increase percentage.
- Superintendent is responsible for over 30,000 students and a budget of over 400 million dollars; huge responsibility and the position is worthy of even more than is proposed.
- Raise would bring the Superintendent under the median for Northern Colorado.
- Board members thanked the Superintendent, Cabinet and staff for a good school year and wished all a restful, rejuvenating summer.
