Early Childhood Program Overview

Mission: We exist for our community's most vulnerable families. We ensure that all our enrolled children are ready for and will be successful in kindergarten.

Vision: We empower our community's eligible children and families to build a foundation for learning, as measured by their readiness for kindergarten and beyond.

Serving families that are expecting the birth of a child and children from birth to kindergarten, Poudre School District's Early Childhood Education Department (PSD ECE) uses multiple funding sources to provide critical educational services across the District and Larimer County. Services include family and child education; developmental and health screenings; health, mental health, and dental services; interventions for children with identified needs; home visits; family support, including follow-up for chronic absence; socialization events; and parenting classes.

Age groups served and funding include:

- Expecting families and their prenatal children
- Early Head Start families, ages 0-3 years
- Colorado Preschool Program families, ages 3-5 years
- Integrated Services families, ages 3-5 years
- Head Start families, ages 3-5 years
- Tuition-based families, ages 3-5 years

Locations

Preschool programs are in 20 of PSD's elementary schools and five community day care and education centers within the Poudre School District's 1,800 square mile catchment area. Early Head Start home visiting occurs across Larimer County, and includes a small number of slots at a community day care and education center. These locations give families flexibility based on their needs.

Costs/Availability

We offer a multitude of options, depending on your family's unique qualifying factors:

- Free weekly home visits with to promote family engagement and child development for pregnant women and families with children less than three years of age.
- A limited number of half-day, four-day-per-week Pre-K tuition spaces (Go online to view tuition rates, subject to change)
- Unlimited no-cost Pre-K spaces for children who qualify for special education services
- Full- and half-day no-cost Pre-K spaces for families that meet admission criteria

Achievement Data & Kindergarten Readiness

The PSD ECE Program uses Teaching Strategies GOLD (TS GOLD) as its assessment tool. TS GOLD aligns to the Head Start Child Development and Early Learning Outcomes Framework and Colorado Academic Preschool Standards (CAS) for preschool. Instructional staff, including home visitors, use this tool throughout the school year to assess children's growth and report assessment outcomes three times annually to the Colorado Department of Education.




Kindergarten Transitions

Preparing Early Childhood Students and Families for Kindergarten Transitions

- PSD ECE holds a Be-Ready Fair with community organizations around Larimer County to support families with the transition to kindergarten.
- PSD ECE shares child assessment information with receiving schools when children transition to kindergarten.
- PSD ECE uses its kindergarten transition booklet during home visits and in consultation with families to guide them through the kindergarten transition process.
- PSD ECE participates in District transition information sharing events, including those for children who are learning English in addition to other languages, and children with developmental or identified needs.
- PSD ECE's Policy Council offers presentations and information-sharing opportunities to assist parents in learning about kindergarten transition.

The Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS)



Classroom Assessment Scoring System reports were provided by Clayton Early Learning. The purpose of the PSD program's annual outside CLASS assessment of all classrooms during the Spring of 2019 was to monitor the quality of instruction and assist in creating the professional development plan for the coming year. Since identifying Instructional Support as area for improvement, the program has seen an incremental increase in this domain. All domain averages exceed the average for preschool programs nationwide.




Head Start and Early Head Start Grants 2019 Grant Year (November 1, 2018 to October 31, 2019)

EHS Served – 142



Eligible Children and Families Served by PSD ECE

The eligibility arrow graphic below shows how we use eligibility factors to enroll families of young children for free early childhood services. Families eligible for Early Head Start and Head Start may have factors such as having an income below the Federal poverty guidelines, receiving public assistance such as TANF or SSI, and being doubled up or homeless. Foster children are eligible regardless of their foster family's income.







Each year across Larimer County, the estimated number of eligible children less than 5 years old is 1,964 with 408 eligible pregnant women. Each year there are 1,080 eligible children within the PSD catchment area.
