N/A	Classroom Supplies: 4 th & 5 th Grade	\$25.00	To cover all or a portion of purchasing expendable supplies to be used by all students in the class including, but not limited to, scissors, highlighters, post-it-notes, and glue.	All students will have access to the classroom supplies regardless of whether payment is made.
1	Pottery	\$10.00	To cover all or a portion of the cost of purchasing expendable supplies to be used by students for projects including, but not limited to, clay, clay tools, and glazes.	Students who do not pay will be required to complete their projects with supplies on hand rather than choose their glaze and clay.
1	Printmaking	\$10.00	To cover all or a portion of the cost of purchasing expendable supplies to be used by students for projects including, but not limited to, ink, specialty ink, screens, and emulsion.	Students who do not pay will be required to complete their projects with stencils rather than screen printing.

N/A	Intensive Weeks: Intensives (Secondary)	\$125.00	To cover all or a portion of the total cost of providing local experiences in which students participate during normal school hours. Experiences include but are not limited to activities such as cooking, glassblowing, songwriting, pine beetle studies, and fashion design.	All students will be allowed to participate in intensives regardless of whether payment is made.
X	Intensive Weeks: Adventures (Secondary)	\$60.00- \$1,200.00	This charge is in addition to the \$125.00 for Intensives and serves to cover all or a portion of the cost of extended day or overnight experiences in which students are traveling with their teachers and classmates. Trips could include but are not limited to France, Costa Rica, Peru, the Florida Keys, Yellowstone, Arches National Park, Heifer International's Global Village in Arkansas, the Grand Canyon, and Grand Gulch, UT.	Students who do not pay will not be allowed to participate in adventures and instead will be offered intensives.
N/A	Enrichment Field Work Experiences. (Elementary)	\$40.00	To cover all or a portion of elementary enrichment field work experiences.	All students can participate in enrichment field work experiences regardless of whether payment is made.

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
