1	Cooking for Health and Nutrition	\$20.00	To cover all or a portion of the cost of purchasing expendable supplies/ingredients for cooking projects including, but not limited to, recipe ingredients, food storage, and cleaning supplies.	Students who do not pay will not participate hands-on in the labs and will be given educationally comparable assignments, such as serving as a judge, when applicable.

1	Musical Theater Production Supplies	\$20.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own copy of the script necessary to participate in performances.	Students who do not pay will be provided with a script that must be returned at the end of the semester.
1	Band, Choir and Orchestra Performance T-Shirt (6 <sup>th</sup> Grade Only)	\$8.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own music shirt necessary to participate in required performances.	Students who do not pay will not receive their own t-shirt. Students can bring in a shirt from a previous year (i.e. sibling's t-shirt) or will be loaned a t-shirt for performances. The loaned shirt must be returned after each performance.
1	Instrument Rental	\$50.00 per instrument	Rental charge to offset the cost maintenance of musical instruments. The charge is based on the average cost of routine maintenance. Students who want an instrument at home and at school may rent the same instrument for an additional \$15.00.	Students may provide their own instrument. Students who do not pay or provide their own instrument will be required to complete alternative written assignments in class until they have an instrument.
1	Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO) – Art Calligraphy Supplies	\$5.00	To cover all or a portion of the cost of purchasing expendable supplies for students to use for projects including, but not limited to, pens, ink, and specialty paper.	Students may furnish their own supplies. Students who do not pay or furnish their own supplies will not receive the supplies and will instead have access to a classroom set of supplies during school hours that cannot be taken off school grounds and/or use recycled or recyclable supplies for their projects.
1	Pottery and Sculpture Supplies	\$20.00	To cover all or a portion of the cost of purchasing expendable supplies for students to use for projects including, but not limited to, clay, polymer clay, pencils, markers, poster board, tape, paint brushes, acrylic paint, glaze paint, wire, and glue gun sticks.	Students may furnish their own supplies. Students who do not pay or furnish their own supplies will not receive the supplies and will instead have access to a classroom set of supplies during school hours that cannot be taken off school grounds and/or use recycled or recyclable supplies for their projects.
