Students can bring in a shirt from a previous year or will be provided with recycled shirt to use for performances. The shirt must be returned after each performance.
1	Select Choir Attire	\$15.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own polo shirt for required performances.	Students who do not pay will not receive their own polo shirt. Students can bring in a shirt from a previous year or will be provided with recycled polo shirt to use for performances. The polo shirt must be returned after each performance.
