State and Regional Level	Updates from CDE or North Central Region 2026 Colorado Legislative session -- The state budget is facing a \$1.2 billion deficit. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Colorado is facing significant fiscal constraints driven by rising Medicaid and correctional costs, TABOR limitations, impacts from federal tax changes, and a limited ability to grow overall spending. Education, as one of the largest portions of the state budget, is unavoidably part of that conversation.• Gifted CDE grant funding is currently strong, but there might be cuts this legislative session. Stay tuned.	

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District Level	<p>PSD updates/info that affect PSD Gifted Program</p> <p>Poudre School District's Board of Education is resuming its discussion about school closures and consolidations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recommendations for consolidations and closures could come as early as this fall after a committee tasked with making them by spring of 2027 was asked to speed up its timeline because of increased concerns about state and federal funding. • Enrollment is dropping again in 26-27. "The broader picture is clear: this trend is not simply about families choosing one school over another. There are fewer school-aged children living within our district boundaries.
