Programming Opportunities for Gifted Learners

Students in 3rd through 5th grade who qualify, participate in daily math and reading enrichment groups. These groups do not replace their classroom instruction but rather challenge students with deeper exploration of concepts. In reading enrichment, students engage in a wide variety of activities which may include novel studies, passion projects, opportunities for cross curricular connections, as well as rich discussions with like-minded peers. In math enrichment, students are provided with opportunities for deeper and more creative thinking on mathematical topics.

Students participate in the goal-setting process that involves a mid-year and end-of-year reflection activity. Parents are viewed as partners and are encouraged to provide input at all stages of the ALP process.
