# Affective programming for GT students



Preston provides opportunities for students to develop strengths and interests during exploratory electives.

- Where Everybody Belongs (WEB) is a transition program for 6th grade students that includes intentional small group activities led by 8th grade peer leaders, socials for new students, and culture building.
- Leadership is an elective course for 8th grade students. During this class, students are involved in community service, volunteering, mentoring small groups of 6th grade students, implementing positive campaigns throughout the school (kindness, activity nights, philanthropy).
- Peace Circles are a social emotional component of the PE curriculum for 7th and 8th grade students.
- Preston embraces the Expect Respect curriculum. This is a student and teacher led program that promotes positive school culture, kindness, and upstanding behavior.
- PAWS (positive choices, attitude, work ethic, sense of community): This is a school wide PBIS system to promote positive culture at Preston.
