With approximately one-third of the student population participating in Gifted and Talented (GT) education, Kinard Middle School supports a robust GT program where students are meaningfully engaged in learning experiences designed to help them achieve their academic and affective Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) goals and blended with ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Plans). Kinard is dedicated to ensuring high levels of learning for all students and cultivates a safe, inclusive community where staff members are responsive to the unique needs of each learner. he school's GT Site Coordinator plays a critical role in maintaining fidelity in the GT identification process by thoroughly analyzing academic data for all incoming and newly enrolled students. This process includes careful consideration of culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds as well as twice-exceptional characteristics to ensure equitable identification practices. Beyond facilitating authentic ALP learning experiences, the GT Coordinator partners closely with teachers to support the advanced academic needs of learners in the GT program for their continued successful growth and achievement in knowledge, essential skills and Kinard character. Kinard offers a wide array of accelerated options, enrichment opportunities and leadership service programs that enhance learning for gifted and talented education.

Programming Opportunities for Gifted Learners

Sixth through eighth graders who meet the academic qualifications have opportunities for accelerated math courses for high school credit, and all students are also offered world language courses (high school credit for 1B & 2). Seventh and eighth graders can apply for honors courses in English, Science, Social Studies, Select Choirs, Symphonic Band and Symphony Orchestra. Kinard's Gifted and Talented Program focuses on development of critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication. Students with ALPs explore areas of interest through inquiry projects, career mentorship, college visits, service learning, philanthropy, innovation in technology and engineering, performing and visual arts, content extensions and ability grouping.

Overview of the GT program at this school



Kinard's GT Program:

- Encompasses 255 students identified for Gifted and Talented with Advanced Learning Plans.
- Establishes fidelity in the identification process by recognizing all essential factors including culturally, linguistically diverse and twice-exceptional characteristics.
- Develops authentic ALPs aligned to Colorado gifted and talented state standards with goal choice enrichment options that inspire and challenge students to achieve at high levels.
- Focuses on strength-based approaches to advance students' knowledge and skills.
- Provides learning experiences beyond the classroom with real world connections.
- Connects students with similar interests through a wide variety of enrichment opportunities.
- Provides extensions for deeper inquiry into the Core Knowledge curriculum.
- Empowers students' personal and future success through the Colorado Essential Skills Standards.

Advanced Learning Plan process at this school



Students in Kinard's Gifted and Talented (GT) Program collaborate with staff, teachers, and parents/guardians each fall to develop new Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) goals. This student-centered process empowers learners to take ownership of their growth, moving from initial engagement to meaningful, personalized goal setting aligned with their identified areas of strength. With input and guidance from teachers, the GT Coordinator, and parents/guardians, students identify the academic skills most relevant for growing their GT strength area(s) within their core content courses (i.e. math and ELA classes). The selected academic skills for growth form the foundation of the **Achievement Goal**. Additionally, enrichment opportunities—aligned to students' special interests, compelling inquiry, or specific academic challenges—can be added to further deepen and personalize the student's learning journey beyond the Core Knowledge curriculum. The **ALP Goals are blended with the ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Plan)** and uploaded to Xello. This transparent approach provides year-round accessibility to the ALP for students, families, and teachers, allowing for tracking of ALP goal progress and to continue the

development for long-term college and career planning.

Throughout the year, students meet with their GT Coordinator and specific academic teachers for their Achievement Goal skill growth and enrichment options. Academic skill progress connected to the student's GT identification area(s) are tracked and managed in the student's content course(s). The Achievement Goal enrichment options create daily, weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly opportunities for students to actively participate with their teacher or GT Coordinator and their group in collaborative student-centered learning largely during the school day.

Equally important to academic development of students in the Kinard GT Program is the cultivation of the Colorado Essential Skills-a set of standards that are competencies required for postsecondary success, workforce readiness, and active citizenship. These skills include Critical Thinking, Collaboration, Self-Direction, and Self-Awareness to name several.

Each year, students explore the Essential Skills in meeting with the GT Coordinator to begin the process of selecting their Affective Goal. Using a rubric and linear scale, students self-assess their confidence and proficiency in the Essential Skills. Based on this reflection, they choose one skill as a focus area for growth over the academic year.

This selected skill becomes the student's Affective Goal, practiced both in and out of the classroom. Students have structured opportunities throughout the year to receive instruction, reflect on their progress, engage in self-assessment, and receive feedback from teachers and the GT Coordinator in support of continued development.

Programming opportunities for GT students



Accelerated math classes for high school credit; honors courses in English, science and social studies; Select Choirs, Symphonic Band and Symphony Orchestra; ALP goal enrichment options including inquiry projects, career mentorship, college visits, service learning, philanthropy, innovation in technology and engineering, performing and visual arts, content extensions, ability grouping, cluster grouping and world language courses for high school credit.

Affective programming for GT students



At Kinard Core Knowledge Middle School, students are empowered to achieve personal and academic growth, exploration for college and career readiness, and are supported in their general wellness and mental health through a team approach led by Kinard's school counselors, and in collaboration with teachers and the Kinard GT Program. The Kinard GT Program specifically develops capacity through aligning the ALP Affective Goal choices to the Colorado Essential Skills state standards. Students and parents are provided with the Essential Skills from CDE to discuss and select a relevant and authentic Affective Goal. Students in the GT program complete check-ins and a reflection with the GT Site Coordinator on their progress growing in their goals. Additionally, there are opportunities available for more in-depth goal choices where students have opportunity to discuss challenges and successes in a safe environment with a school counselor and with other students who share similar affective goals.

Grade-specific GT services



Students in 6th and 7th grade Kinard GT can choose an ALP enrichment that develops leadership skills by participating weekly with the GT Coordinator in Service-Learning, Students in 6th - 8th grade, with a passion for making a difference in their school or local community, can select a weekly ALP enrichment with the Kinard Student Social Justice Team or the Give Next Philanthropy Program. Students in 6th-8th grade, with expressed career interest in engineering, can attend CSU's Engineering Day held during the spring. Short term career mentorships are also possible options as an ALP goal enrichment for students. These opportunities allow students in Kinard's GT Program to connect academically and socially with their community while exploring their individual interests. In career mentorships, the student conducts an individual interview, and with a parent, may make a site-visit to the community member's place of work. For 8th graders with ALPs, there are opportunities through the Kinard GT Program for a college visit to a Colorado higher education institution durina the school vear.
