Overview of the GT program at this school



PCA's GT Program is small and agile. This gives us the flexibility to individualize the experience to each learner. The program coordinator works with students to develop a personalized, Advanced Learning plan (ALP) that addresses their individual goals and how to get there. The students also have opportunities to network and collaborate with the other students in the program during quarterly working luncheons and various activities throughout the year.

The Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) process at PCA includes students creating and writing goals that are blended with their Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) through the student's Xello account.
