SUMMARY: The Poudre School District Foundation (PSDF) ignites opportunities for Poudre School District (PSD) students by mobilizing community resources to support student needs across the District. The Foundation is seeking a passionate, strategic Executive Director to advance this shared vision.

This leader will evolve the Foundation to its next level of impact by collaborating with a dedicated Board of Directors, leveraging the existing strengths and assets of the Foundation and creating strategic linkages and partnerships. The Executive Director will specifically be a hands-on leader for fundraising, community relations/advocacy and operational, financial and HR planning and management. The Executive Director will report to PSD's Director of Career and Innovation and the PSDF's Board of Directors. PSD's Director of Career and Innovation, with input from the PSDF's Board, will be responsible for the Executive Director's annual performance evaluation.

Description of Job Tasks
<p>1. Leadership:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Participate with the Poudre School District Foundation Board of Directors in developing a vision and strategic plan to guide the Foundation.• Pursue and cultivate relationships with key business and community members.• Lead and facilitate quarterly meetings with PSD leadership.• Serve as a professional advisor to the Board of Directors on all aspects of the Foundation's activities.• Develop relationships and foster effective teamwork with all levels of PSD staff, including executives, program owners and school teams.• Represent the Foundation at community activities to enhance the Foundation's community profile.
<p>2. Fundraising:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Plan and carry out strategies to renew and increase gifts from current donors and attract new donors.• Plan, develop and implement strategies to cultivate and manage relationships with large foundations and corporate partners/sponsors.• Develop and implement fundraising strategies in collaboration with PSDF's Board of Directors.• Set annual goals, with PSDF Board approval, based on determined fundraising strategies including donors' visits, solicitations, proposals, grant proposals, philanthropic gifts, etc.• Collaborate with PSD leadership team to identify District funding priorities and understand program needs.• Coordinate and oversee events hosted by the Foundation. This may include fundraising and donor cultivation events.

<p>3. Community relations/advocacy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Communicate with stakeholders to keep them informed of the work of the Foundation and to identify changes in the community served by the Foundation.• Compile and disseminate regular, ongoing communications and/or presentations for the PSDF Board of Directors, PSD Board of Education and PSD executive staff.• Establish good working relationships and collaborative arrangements with community groups, funders, politicians, and other organizations to help achieve the goals of the Foundation.• Develop and produce communications (brochures, marketing materials, press releases, website, social media, etc.) to educate the community about the mission of the Foundation as well as particular special events and services.• Collaborate with the PSD Partnership Coordinator for efficient engagement of the business community and internal resources.
<p>4. Operational planning and management:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Oversee the efficient and effective day-to-day operations of the Foundation, including management, training and review of any staff.• Ensure that personnel, client, donor and volunteer files are securely stored, and privacy/confidentiality is maintained.• Provide support to the PSDF Board by preparing meeting agendas and supporting materials.• Maintain office and software systems to support all development projects and program operations.• Prepare quality financial documents to include fundraising summaries, budgets, individual committee and special event activities.• Work with the District and Foundation committees in managing all programs and services of the Foundation.• Attend all Foundation board meetings and select committee meetings.

Financial planning and management:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Work with the PSDF Finance Committee to prepare annual budgets.• Understand financial statements and position of the Foundation to support sound spending and strategic proposals for the Foundation.• Approve expenditures within the authority delegated by the PSDF Board.• Ensure that sound bookkeeping and accounting procedures are followed by monitoring activities of the third-party bookkeeper.• Create and track Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) for Foundation programs and fundraising.
<p>6. Perform other duties as assigned</p>

EDUCATION AND RELATED WORK EXPERIENCE:

- Minimum of five years of fundraising and/or business development experience.
