SUMMARY: Responsible for driving routes and district approved field/activity trips as assigned by Dispatch, Activities Scheduler, and supervisors. Employee may be called upon to perform other duties in order to fill work hours assigned such as clerical, dispatch coverage, vehicle cleaning, or light duty maintenance when not assigned to bus driving.
