- Has earned high school credits required for graduation before entering the program



Transition Services

Students in the Cooper Home Pathway transition into their next phase of life by gradually increasing responsibility in order to gain independence.

Services students receive include:

- Job Coaching
- Training in work-related skills
- Planning menus, grocery shopping, and cooking
- Riding public transportation
- Developing organizational skills, including keeping a weekly schedule

Cooper Home students...

- Are eligible for transportation to and from Cooper Home through PSD Transportation Services
- Attend the program 2-3 days per week
- Purchase a bus pass. In addition, incidental money is needed for recreation and leisure activities.
- Upon completion of the program, receive a Certificate of Completion or a PSD Diploma if graduation requirements have been met.
