

IGA - CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

Ongoing curriculum review is necessary to meet the needs of students.

Successful curriculum development is a cooperative enterprise involving all impacted staff members, carried out under the leadership of the superintendent, and using multiple resources. Carefully conducted and supervised experimentation for curriculum development also is desirable.

The curriculum shall include a program of instruction based on and designed to enable students to meet those standards (the Board-adopted standards).

The Board expects its faculty and administration to regularly evaluate curriculum instruction additions to the instructional program.

All teachers have professional obligations to work on curriculum committees. It is expected that all teachers will contribute to curriculum work. The Board will hear regular reports on district programs, as well as on the ongoing work of the curriculum committees.
