Question – CODFPC has adopted and enforces the 2015 International Codes. Per section 1704.2 (Special Inspections and Tests) "The owner or the owner's authorized agent, other than the contractor, shall employ one or more approved agencies to provide special inspections and tests during construction." The contractor TBD would normally hire the Engineer of Record. As a third-party inspection agency, we would verify, regulate and monitor the special inspectors for this project. Will that meet this requirement, or are you looking for the third party to hire the Engineer of Record?
