Overview of Gifted Program Gifted & Talented Site Coordinator	Bacon Elementary has a wide range of Gifted and Talented services. Fourth and fifth grade gifted language arts students meet with the gifted teacher five days a week with a reading, writing and technology focus. In addition, fourth and fifth grade gifted math students have the opportunity to accelerate in math (one year advanced curriculum) five days a week. Third grade students work on an enriched curriculum in math and language arts with intellectual peers in the regular classroom to focus on areas of strength. Emily Vangermeersch
Structure (Grouping of Gifted Learners)	Students are grouped with intellectual peers in a pull-out setting for math and language arts. Gifted students in primary grades have the opportunity to explore their goals with classroom differentiation.
Enrichment Opportunities for gifted learners during school	Gifted learners in 4/5 meet with a GT teacher five days a week for instruction. Gifted learners in 3 rd grade have enrichment opportunities within the regular classroom s in a small group setting.
Enrichment Opportunities for gifted learners after school	Lego Robotics, Chess Club, BEST (Bacon Energy Savings Team), Choir, Student Council, Foreign language offerings: Spanish, German and American Sign Language, Music enrichment, Science-engineering enrichment
Social/Emotional programming	The GT site coordinator and school counselor work together to address social/emotional issues with small groups of gifted students.
Content Extensions	 5th grade gifted math students are pulled out for an Accelerated Math Program. This program is a two-year commitment and students are taught 6th Grade Math Curriculum. Gifted learners are joined by additional advanced math students who have met the school's criteria. 5th grade Gifted Language Arts learners are pulled out for small group reading replacement instruction which emphasizing critical thinking, research and technology. 4th grade gifted math students are pulled out for an Accelerated Math Program. This program is a two-year commitment and students are taught 5th Grade Math Curriculum. Gifted learners are joined by additional advanced math students who have met the school's criteria. 4th grade Gifted Language Arts learners are pulled out during reading time for small group language arts enrichment and technology extensions.

	 3rd grade Gifted Language Arts learners are grouped together for targeted advanced instruction in a small group within the regular classroom setting using Junior Great Books, and?. 3rd grade Gifted Math learners are grouped together for enrichment opportunities during math instruction.
Differentiation for gifted in the regular classroom	Teachers differentiate by choosing appropriate content for students, by varying the process and allowing choice of products. A few examples are: teachers offer tiered assignments, ability grouping, curriculum compacting, extension activities, interest-based focus groups, open-ended questions and projects, Great Books, choice boards, tic-tac-toe menus, adapt math games, leveled pacing, and higher-order questioning.
Acceleration Opportunities	4 th and 5 th grade math students who meet the required indicators have the opportunity to take math curriculum that is one year advanced.
