11.1 Board-Superintendent Relationship Policies

Board discussion included:

• Vice President Zamora invited Board members to increase focus on the policies.

11.2 Supporting Students with Dyslexia in PSD

Curriculum Teaching and Learning Facilitator Shauna Stahl and Integrated Services Assistant Director of Teaching and Learning Nora Love provided the update.

Board discussion included:

- Screenings occur three times a year; strategies are being embedded now.
- Dyslexia identification must be supported by specific data.
- Early signs of Dyslexia appear before a child can access word reading.
- Working with Early Childhood to address screenings.
- Layered supports start in kindergarten.
- Dibels 8 is a screener used to identify several types of reading difficulties.
- Important to partner with parent(s) to communicate indicators at school and potential indicators at home to discuss path forward for student.
- Examples of support levels were provided.
- School psychologist is part of a team that determines what evaluations are appropriate for a student.

- Dyslexia Professional Development for Universal was widely received, and teachers chose to take extra training; future training will be offered.
- Ninety percent of elementary teachers are trained.
- Communication to parents about Dibels is being discussed.
- Parent(s) should share concerns about student reading struggles with teachers; first level of screening occurs in the classroom.
- Question was raised about any difference in training/identifying for elementary level and secondary level teachers.
- Gratitude was conveyed for the training; teachers will now become advocates for students with dyslexia.

Board recessed at 8:59 p.m. Board reconvened at 9:12 p.m.

11.3 Update on 2024 Debt Free Mill Levy Spending Plan

Chief Finance Office Dave Montoya, Lead Assistant Superintendent Traci Gile, Linton Elementary School Principal Kristin Stolte, and Putnam Elementary School Steve Apodaca provided the update.

Board discussion included:

- Appreciation was expressed for inclusion of musical instruments and curricular fee support.
- At least eighteen elementary schools will have access to increased funding.
- Table with full list of schools is available on the website.
- Five-year projections will be used to forecast numbers and trends.
- Important not to overcorrect if a spike is followed by a reduction.
- Oversight committee allows for transparency to voters; committee will report back to the Board and can express concerns or questions.
- Project lists will be available on the website.
- McKinstry data continues to be helpful.
- Staff have been tracking efficiencies of new equipment/models.
- Appreciation was conveyed to the voters for approving the mill levy.
